Dorothy's fight to heal and the place that helped her get back on her feet again

At 86 years old, Dorothy Hadley doesn't whisper her age, she celebrates it. "None of my family made it this far. I'm proud of it," she said with a smile. But just a few years ago, her life changed in many ways.

"I broke my hip dancing Zumba at 79," Dorothy recalled. "I didn't feel my age but after that I went from feeling 45 to 90 all at once." What followed were multiple surgeries that cut her from hip to knee for rod placement, setbacks and two more devastating falls that broke the thigh bone in her already injured leg and displaced the patella on her opposite knee.

After months of hospitals and procedures, she needed more treatment, more strength, more safety and a team to care for her. "I like my independence you know," Dorothy said. "But you can't be totally independent and be safe in this instance. It felt more important to be safe." She found everything she needed in the Extended Care program at Greene County Medical Center.

But coming to the medical center was not unfamiliar territory for Dorothy. For more than 25 years, she served as an activity director for the long-term care department. She planned programs, comforted families and advocated for residents, and now found herself on the other side of care.

Dorothy spent about three months in the program, and when asked what her experience was like, she replied, "Well, I thought it felt like I was in a spa. I got the whirlpool twice a week. The food is great; there is a lot that is fresh made."

But it wasn't just the amenities. "Stay here,"

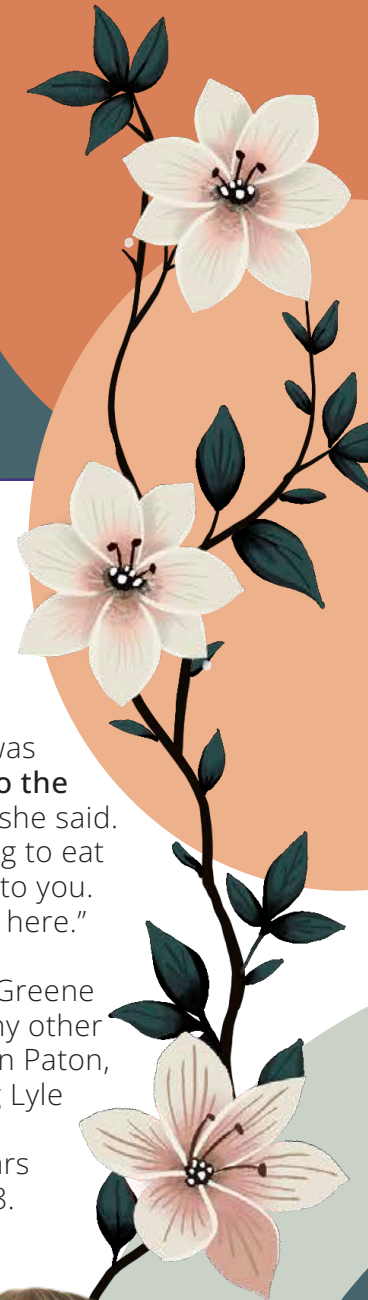
she firmly stated. **"They took really, really good care of me."**

After difficult experiences, numerous falls and a lot of pain, Dorothy said the difference in care at Greene County Medical Center was immediately evident. **"Compared to the big city...there's no comparison,"** she said. For example, "If you want something to eat and it's not mealtime, they're good to you. It's about you. They care about you here."

Dorothy has lived her entire life in Greene County, and she wouldn't have it any other way. Throughout her life she lived in Paton, Grand Junction and Dana, marrying Lyle Hadley in 1961. The couple moved to Jefferson in 2009, sharing 56 years together before his passing in 2018. Dorothy and Lyle raised two children, Kurt, who lives in Jefferson, and Sheila who resides in Maryland.

The Greene County Medical Center Extended Care program offers 24-hour skilled nursing, rehabilitation therapies and personalized support in a compassionate, home-like setting.

"I was worried that my lapses might be early dementia, so my provider recommended I schedule a memory appointment. I was hesitant at first," explained James North, "but meeting with Katelyn Goettsch at 21st Century Rehab changed everything."

North said the Speech Language Pathologist/ Speech Therapist put him at ease, listened to his concerns, answered all his questions and reassured him that much of what he was feeling was normal. "She taught me so much about brain health, hydration, stress, sleep, diet and helpful breathing and relaxation techniques," North added. "Taking the memory test and having it explained so clearly eased many of my fears."

Perhaps most importantly, North appreciated having a safe place to talk without judgement and being able to leave with practical tools he can use every day.

"I'm very grateful for the experience," he said. "Grade A+, though it might have helped if Katelyn had been a Hawkeye fan!" — James North

A Journey of Resilience

A story of hope and healing at Greene County Medical center

Dave Wilson's story is not just one of survival.

It's a testament to the strength of community, the power of cutting-edge care and the unbreakable bonds of family. After battling personal loss and a life-changing diagnosis, Dave found hope again, all thanks to the Team at Greene County Medical Center. His words are a call to action: **Don't wait, reach out. You are not alone.**

"I never thought I'd be here telling this story; but here I am alive, hopeful and more grateful than I ever thought possible," Dave said.

Dave's journey hasn't been an easy one. After the death of a child in 2021 and the devastating loss of his wife in 2025 to breast cancer, life threw yet another curveball; a mass in his colon, later found to have spread to his liver. It was the kind of news no one expects to hear, especially after years of caring for a loved one battling cancer. "I felt terrible about it," Dave admitted. "With her illness over the past several years, I just never really took time to worry about myself."

But when Greene County Medical Center stepped in, Dave found new hope. The very same hospital that had served his wife during her first battle now offered the treatments he needed to fight his own cancer. This included life-saving chemotherapy services available right in his own backyard.

"I was just so excited to find out they were offering this back at Greene County Medical Center again," he said. "That has saved me a lot of trips to Des Moines and I felt like a weight had been lifted off of me."

Dave's treatment was not just about medical procedures. It was the compassionate care that truly made a difference. He credits the hospital's Oncology Team for more than just their expertise; it was the human connection that made all the difference. From the nurses who made him feel like family to the dedicated staff who went out of their way to ensure comfort, Dave felt seen, heard and cared for. "I just love those guys. They were a lot of fun to be around; Amber, Amanda, Katie, Dr. Merchant and all the others, I just love them to pieces," Dave said in a voice filled with gratitude. "They just treated me like a king. They were fantastic, just super and professional at the same time."

Recently, that compassion came full circle in an emotional moment that Dave says he will never forget. His care Team, family, friends, staff and administration gathered around as Dave was invited to ring the bell celebrating the final infusion in this round of his treatment. As the first patient to reach this milestone since services were renewed at Greene County Medical Center, there were a lot of smiles, some tears and loud applause. For Dave, who rang that bell all the way down the corridor from his treatment room to the front desk, the sound was not just the end of a treatment cycle. After so much loss, it was a moment of joy and hope to be shared with those who have walked beside him every step of the way.

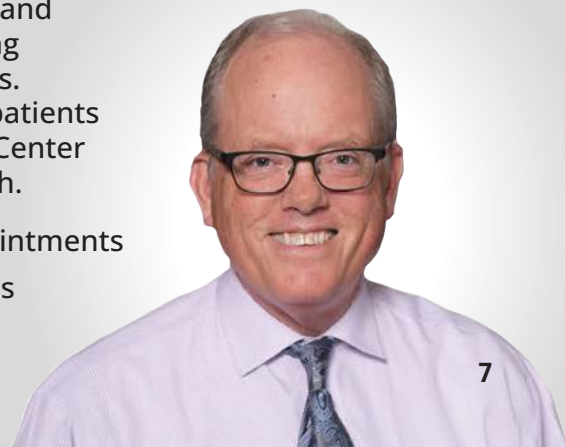

This celebration of innovation was filled with gratitude for the foresight of leaders and donors who continue to shape the future of local healthcare.

"Thanks to the vision of previous Board Trustees, a dedicated space was created for the future placement of an MRI during a renovation in 2015,"

explained CEO, Chad Butterfield.

Before attendees were split into groups for a look at the MRI and several other areas of the medical center, Foundation Director, Nancy Houska reminded them, "**Your support of our mission and vision has a direct and positive impact on every patient and family member who walks through our doors.**"

Specialty Provider Dates, Blood Drives & Events at Your Fingertips

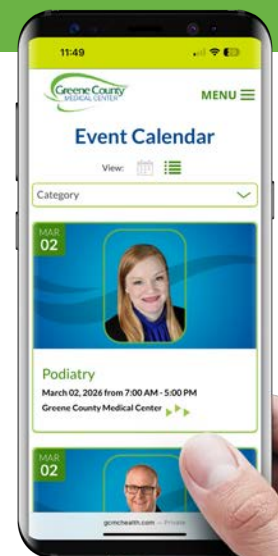
The right care is right here at Greene County Medical Center, and those details are now at your fingertips with a new online calendar.

The Right MRI Care, Right Here

Jake Garnett remembers the exact moment in November of 2024 that his life changed forever.

"I went into the ditch, and that was that. I bumped my head on top of my sunroof and was instantly paralyzed."

There was no long warning, no gradual decline. Just a single accident that left him facing permanent paralysis and a lifetime of medical care. Since that day, imaging, specialty appointments and emergency visits have become part of everyday life. Jake has had several MRIs since the accident and knows they will continue. This level of monitoring is not temporary; it is ongoing and necessary.

After the accident, Jake could no longer live independently. His mother, Beth Thielen, brought him home and became his full-time caregiver. Every appointment, every transfer and every mile on the road begins with her. Getting Jake out the door for an appointment is not simple. "It takes me at least two hours to get him ready and into the van," Beth explained. Even preparing for a single appointment requires physical strength, time and careful coordination. That effort is multiplied when care is far away. And the cost is not just exhaustion.

Travel itself puts Jake at risk. Due to the extent of his injuries, his body can no longer regulate temperature, making both cold and heat dangerous. Beth described what that means in real

terms. "It takes hours and hours to get him warmed back up. And when he overheats, he can't feel it." These swings affect his blood pressure and can trigger serious complications."

For Jake, being outside for prolonged periods is simply not an option. And yet, without local access to advanced imaging, this is exactly what would be required. Long drives, extended transfers and hours away from the controlled environment his body depends on. That is why having MRI services available in Jefferson is critical. When asked how important it is to have that service available on a daily basis, Jake responded without hesitation: "Oh man, it's very important."

Beth sees the difference in miles, minutes and physical toll. "The least amount of time he's out of the house, the better," she said. "A trip to Jefferson is manageable. A trip to Des Moines or another larger hospital is not. It's a 20-minute ride for him," she explained, "compared to an hour or more there and an hour or more back." Each additional mile increases pain, fatigue and risk, for both of them.

Beyond the logistics, there is something deeply personal about receiving care close to home. Jake noticed it immediately.

"At Greene County Medical Center, they know you and they know your needs."

For someone whose care is frequent and lifelong, that familiarity brings dignity and trust.

For Beth, the value is clear and constant. "Having the hospital here in Jefferson and having them add more and more services means I don't have to take him so far. This is extremely valuable for us, extremely valuable."

For families like Jake's state-of-the-art care in a rural community is not just about convenience or preference, it is about ensuring that when life changes in an instant, the care you need to survive and live afterward is already close to home.
