FINANCIAL REPORT

At the end of 2022, the Auxiliary had \$12,545 in the Gift Garden account and \$17,585 in the fundraiser account for a total of \$30,131. However, there were some outstanding bills that had not been deducted- \$3,000 for scholarship recipients and \$2,306 in new merchandise for the Gift Garden.

Donations to the Hospital

In December, we donated Christmas presents to patients in Extended Care. At the February 6 meeting the Auxiliary members voted to continue providing free coffee in the cafeteria through the first six months of the year. They also voted to pay up to \$1750 for a rowing machine and cable weight system to be used for cardiac and pulmonary rehab patients. These pieces of equipment were requested by Amy Sessions and Emily Ostrander from the Care Management Department. Members also voted to pay the \$59.00 registration for up to 3 members to attend a conference in Des Moines so that they could meet with other auxiliary members across the state and share ideas.
